I WANT TO LEARN ENGLISH - WHAT SHOULD I DO?

Step 1 Visit <u>www.richmondce.ca</u> and register to take an English Test for Adult Secondary

Step 2 Take the English Test in person at Adult Education Centre,

12091 Cambie Road

Step 3 Wait for test results to be sent to you by e-mail within a week of test date.

Step 4 Note registration dates for each term. Register for classes according to your test result

or one level lower. Registration starts at 9 pm online, www.richmondce.ca.

First come, first served.

Step 5 If a class is full, make sure to add your name to Waitlist. You will be contacted as soon as space

becomes available within the first two weeks of term.



English Test (\$45)

- For students who have never attended Richmond Continuing Education, who do not have Grade 10 English from Canada, or if it has been more than two years since you have taken classes with us.
- Taken in person, using a computer at the Richmond Adult Education Centre.
- Covers Grammar, Reading, Listening and Writing, and takes about two hours to complete.
- Test results available by email within a week of test date. Results are valid for one year and can be used to register for Richmond Continuing Education courses only.
- Outside assessment test results eg IELTS, TOEFL, not accepted.

WHAT IS THE ADULT GRADUATION DIPLOMA

The British Columbia Adult Graduation Diploma, also known as the Adult Dogwood, is a high school equivalency diploma for adults aged 18 and older in British Columbia who wish to complete their secondary school graduation requirements. It allows adults to earn a diploma by completing specific courses or through prior learning assessment.

To graduate with an Adult Graduation Diploma, students must be at least 18 years old and have successfully completed a minimum of five (5) courses (20 credits):

- > English Studies 12 or English First Peoples 12; +
- > Math 11 or Math 12; +
- > Three (3) Grade 12 courses OR Social Studies 11 and two (2) Grade 12 courses

While the Adult Graduation Diploma is acceptable with most post-secondary institutions, specific pre-requisite courses may be required by some post-secondary programs. Students are encouraged to do their own research on the necessary requirements for admission into their program of choice.

HOW MUCH DOES IT COST

\$0 - students who meet eligibility requirements and have not graduated from secondary school in BC or anywhere around the world.

\$550 - graduated adults who wish to take Grade 10 English/Math and General Academic courses

PRE-REQUISITES

Richmond Continuing Education has established minimum prerequisite marks and courses. Some students may be required to complete an English Assessment in order to be placed in courses within the Adult Secondary Program.

WAITLISTS

If a course is full, please add your name to the Waitlist. Using our online registration system, click on the name of the course you wish to be waitlisted for - select "Add to Waitlist". More classes may be opened if there is sufficient interest and if classroom space is available. You will be contacted only if a space becomes available.

ATTENDANCE

Regular attendance is expected to ensure academic success. As our school terms are short (only 32 sessions long), we strongly advise students not to miss more than five (5) sessions. Extended absences have a negative impact on learning and may result in removal from a course.

Due to limited number of spaces in a course, please register only if you can commit to attending for the entire duration of the course.

WITHDRAWALS & REFUNDS

To withdraw from our courses, please complete a Course Withdrawal Form available from the school office or email rce@sd38.bc.ca

Withdrawal from our blended, online courses may result in a student not being able to register for the same course for one year.

Where tuition fees apply, refunds of said fees (less 15% transaction fee) are issued only for courses cancelled by Richmond Continuing Education. There are no tuition refunds for student withdrawals.

REPORT CARDS, TRANSCRIPTS & GRADUATION DIPLOMA

Report cards are issued to adult secondary students at mid-term and at the end of each term/semester.

At the end of each term/semester, final course marks are submitted to the BC Ministry of Education. Students who successfully complete a Grade 11 or Grade 12 course will see their final mark reflected on their official transcript.

Transcripts may be used to apply for admission to colleges or universities or for job search purposes.

Students may view their transcripts through the BC Ministry of Education's online Student Transcripts Service (STS). This service allows students to order official transcripts or graduation diplomas from BC or Yukon secondary schools.

Students who meet graduation requirements will receive a graduation diploma from the Ministry of Education.

Q: How do I register for courses?

A: In person English courses - online via www.richmondce.ca. All blended online courses - through our Academic Advisor, Bob Mostar (604-668-7899 ext 1, bmostat@sd38.bc.ca)

Q: I took some Foundations Language courses at another Continuing Education centre. Do I still need to take the English Test?

A: Please provide a copy of your report card for our review and we will let you know if an English Test is needed.

Q: I was a BC high school student on the 2014 or 2023 grad program but I did not graduate. Can I transfer my previous course credits to the Adult Grad Program?

A: Yes, you may transfer some of your previous course credits to the Adult Grad Program. However, at least three courses must be completed after enrolling in the Adult Grad Program.

Q: I attend high school during the day. Can I take courses with Continuing Ed at night?

A: Yes, provided you have a letter of permission from your high school Principal. Please speak with your high school counsellor and parents/ guardians before making an appointment to see our Academic Advisor.

Q: I graduated in another country. Can I still take high school courses with Richmond Continuing Education, and will I be able to get a BC graduation diploma?

A: Yes, you may take high school courses with us even though you have graduated from high school in another country. However, please note that some courses are tuition free; some will cost \$550 for graduated adults. See List of Tuition Free Courses for Graduated Adults on pg 2.

Q: I don't live in Richmond; can I still take courses with Richmond Continuing Ed?

A: Yes. Our in-person, teacher-led courses are available for any student who ordinarily resides in BC.

Q: How long will it take to complete my graduation program?

A: The length of time you need to graduate will depend on how many courses you have to complete; which graduation program you are on; how much time you have in your schedule to attend class or work on courses; your other commitments.

Q: Does Richmond Continuing Education help students find employment after graduation from adult secondary or REAP?

A: No.

Q: Will I get a tax receipt for the tuition fees that I paid for the Richmond EA Program?

A: No we do not issue tax receipts for REAP tuition fees paid.
